The Honors College provides



- Superior students with our best faculty in small classes
- The setting of a small liberal arts college combined with the resources and varied disciplines of a larger university
- State-of-the-art building with classroom and study spaces
- No special application required. Incoming freshmen need a 3.5 high school GPA and a 25 ACT. Transfer & continuing students need a 3.25 GPA.



Buchanan Scholarship



- Competitive with a minimum ACT of 29 (1360 SAT) and a 3.5 GPA
- Must apply separately by December 1st directly to the Honors College
- Tuition-based Scholarship:
 16 hours per semester and
 \$500 for books

Buchanan Fellows

12th Class of Buchanan Fellows (2018)

Screened 276 applicants.

Average ACT = 33.6 and Average High School GPA = 3.953



Transfer Honors Fellowship

- Transfer Honors
 Fellowship: \$3500 for four
 semesters –
 3.5 GPA required
- Must have already completed 60 hrs. prior to fall enrollment at MTSU
- Separate Scholarship Application Required



Sixth class of **Transfer Fellows** (2018)
Screened: 73 applicants.
Average GPA = 3.88
Representing 18 different transfer institutions

Continued Growth!

- Total Enrollment: 853 h.c./1295 s.c. (F17) 20.65% Increase since Fall 2014
- 74 Honors sections: 90.7% capacity (F17)
- Thesis Writers: 8130% increase since Fall 2014
- Fellowship Office Application Submissions
 115% increase since Fall 2014
- Recruitment Activities85.7% increase since Fall 2014


- Fall 2015 = 11.8%




