
WHAT'S NEW WITH COMM?

- 3. Complete 12 semester credit-hours or more in communication (COMM/ORCO)
- 4. Have a minimum GPA of 3.25 for all communication courses (COMM/ORCO)





BLUE RAIDER DEBATE TEAM




