ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

MIDDLE TENNESSEE SATE UNIVERSITY

AND

NASHVILLE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

AAS in Computer Information Technology to BS in Professional Studies

Articulation Agreement

Middle Tennessee State University and Nashville State Community College

This articulation agreement outlines a joint program of study between Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) and Nashville State Community College (Nashville State). The agreement specifies how the AAS degree in Computer Information Technology from Nashville State can transfer into the BS program in Professional Studies at MTSU.

Nashville State students who follow the program of study outlined in the appendix of this agreement are given academic credit for courses listed in the curriculum matrix. In the event of program revisions at MTSU or Nashville State, this agreement is subject to revision. This agreement is in accordance with guidelines established by the Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) for articulation agreements between community colleges and universities.

<u>Term</u> – This Agreement will be effective from the date of final signature below, the Effective Date, until terminated in writing by either party. It is agreed that if terminated, both institutions will honor the terms of the Agreement until the end of the next admissions applications and review period of MTSU.

<u>Post-Termination</u>- Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason, Nashville State students previously accepted by or admitted to MTSU shall continue to receive the benefits contemplated by this Agreement.

Non-discrimination

The parties agree to comply with Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Executive Order 11,246, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and the related regulations to each. Each party assures that it will not discriminate against any individual including, but not limited to, employees or applicants for employment and/or students because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, age, disability, veteran status, genetic information, national origin, or any other legally protected class with respect to all employment, programs and activities.

The parties also agree to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during their employment without regard to their race, religion, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity/ expression, age, disability, veteran status, genetic information, national origin, or any other legally protected class. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection available to employees and applicants for employment to the extent that such laws are applicable to each party individually.

<u>Binding agreement</u>. This Agreement shall not be binding upon the parties until it is approved by the presidents or designee and the Tennessee Board of Regents.

Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee without regard to its conflict of law provisions.

Confidentiality of Records. All educational records created, disclosed, or maintained pursuant to the terms of this Agreement are confidential and shall be created, disclosed, and maintained pursuant to the provisions of Family Educational Right to Privacy Act, also known as FERPA (20 U.S.C.A. s1232g) and its regulations and, if applicable, the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) 2016/679. Nashville State represents and warrants that its collection, access, use, storage, disposal and disclosure of Personal Information complies with all applicable federal and state privacy and data protection laws, including without limitation, the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act ("GLBA"); the Health Information Portability and Accountability Act ("HIPAA), the FTC's Red Flag Rules and any applicable federal or state laws, as amended, together with regulations promulgated thereunder.

Data Security. Nashville State represents and warrants that Nashville State will maintain compliance with the SSAE16 standard, and shall undertake any audits and risk assessments Nashville State deems necessary to maintain compliance with SSAE16.

Notices. All notices or other written communications relating to termination, expiration, or any other legal matter relating to this Agreement will be effective when received and must be given in writing by courier or reputable overnight delivery service, or by certified mail, return receipt requested, to either party at the following address (or to such other address as such party may substitute, by providing a written notice.)
