The Fact is . . .

- ROTC is a college elective; there is no obligation until your junior year.
- Cadets live no differently than any other students.
- ROTC is not a major; every major at MTSU is compatible with the program.
- ROTC provides for a minor in Military Science and Applied Leadership.
- Cadets attend a 31-day Advanced Camp between the ROTC junior and senior years.
- ROTC is not like the local Army Reserve or National Guard. It is an elective that teaches leadership.

Program Benefits

- Focus on leadership, management skills, problem- solving, goal-setting, and time management
- Promotes values
- Opportunities to attend Airborne School, Air Assault School, and the Nurse Summer Training Program for Nurse Cadets
- Opportunities for internships and cultural diversity programs worldwide
- Provides opportunities for hands-on leadership during labs and ROTC events

Minimum Scholarship Qualifications

- Minimum GPA of 2.5 (3.5 to be competitive)
- 19 on the ACT or 1000 on the SAT (freshman)
 (25 ACT to be competitive)
- By end of the semester the scholarship is offered:
 - Must pass the Army Physical Fitness Test
 - Must pass DOD medical exams
 - Must meet height and weight requirements
 - Maintain a 2.5 GPA in college

Scholarship Benefits

- 100% tuition and fees or \$10,000 per year (\$5,000 per semester) for room and board
- \$1,200 per year (\$600/semester) for books
- Monthly tax-free living stipend of \$420 per month

Minimum Program Qualifications for Upper-Level Courses

- Must maintain 2.0 GPA (minimum required)
- Must be a full-time student
- Must be a U.S. citizen
- Must be less than 31 years old on Dec. 31 in the year of graduation
- Be of sound moral character
- Meet physical standards

Commitment after Graduation

Contract obligation with scholarship

- A minimum of four years full-time active duty, then four years in the Army National Guard, Army Reserve, or Inactive Ready Reserve (a stand-by list) OR
- Eight years of part-time reserve duty in the Army National Guard or the Army Reserve

Contract obligation without scholarship

- A minimum of three years of full-time active duty, then five years in the Army National Guard, Army Reserve, or Inactive Ready Reserve (a stand-by list), OR
- Eight years of part-time reserve duty in the Army National Guard or the Army Reserve

Pay and Promotion (Active Duty)

•	2nd Lieutenant at graduation	\$	52,231
•	1st Lieutenant at 24 months	\$	65,268
•	Captain at 48 months	\$	84,948
•	Major at 10–11 years	\$1	106,506
•	Lieutenant Colonel at 18–19 years	\$1	129,653


- Additional benefits:


