4a. Scope: Work to be accomplished

The University's primary Web portal, Luminis 4 (also known as Pipeline), must be upgraded to the next version, Luminis 5, due to aging hardware and end of support for Luminis 4. The upgrade will include transitioning from 3 physical Sun servers and 1 physical Dell server to approximately 13 virtual machines. In order to implement the new system, ITD requires expertise and assistance from Ellucian Professional Services for system installation and configuration. We obtained a quote for professional services in the amount of approximately \$100,000, and we request \$25,000 towards this total.

4b. Scope: Benefit Statement

The new version of Luminis will provide the University a more robust Web portal with modern authentication options. Furthermore, migrating the underlying infrastructure from physical to virtual machines will reduce power consumption and provide resiliency in the case of disasters since virtual machines can be easily replicated to alternate sites.
