spring 2014 Hyper-V server virtualization/consolidation application, we require separate physical servers for our public Web facing applications for security.

## 4a. Scope: Work to be accomplished

After the successful Hyper-V server implementation funded by our spring 2014 sustainable campus fee application, ITD wishes to expand our Hyper-V server footprint to public Web facing applications. Currently all Hyper-V servers service internal applications, and we require separate physical servers for public Web facing applications operating in our DMZ network for security purposes.

As a result, ITD wishes to purchase two Dell PowerEdge R630 servers for these purposes to expand our ability to host virtual Web servers and reduce the number of physical Web servers. We will host one server in our Cope Administration Building data center and the 2<sup>nd</sup> server in Telecommunications Building data center.

4b. Scope: Benefit Statement

We estimate the project will reduce the electrical and cooling costs for each physical system by approximately 90%, down from approximately \$4,300/year to \$475/year.

This application relates to a larger multi-year project to reduce the operating costs within the University's data centers. ITD estimates that it will be able to reduce power and cooling demands by at least 50% by the end of the project.
