

# DegreeWorks User Guide For Advisors

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## **DegreeWorks Overview**

#### What is DegreeWorks?

DegreeWorks is a comprehensive, user friendly, web-based academic advising and degree audit designed for students and advisors to monitor academic progress towards degree completion. DegreeWorks allow students to stay on track and plan coursework for future terms.

#### How does DegreeWorks work?

DegreeWorks reviews the degree requirement for a program of study and uses academic coursework completed, enrolled, and registered courses to create the degree audit. The degree audit will also show any outstanding requirements.

#### What will I find within the academic degree evaluation audit?

The degree evaluation /audit is set-up in block format and consist of:

- Degree Requirements
- ➤ Learning Support (if applicable)
- Candidacy (if applicable)
- Undergraduate Pre-requisites (if applicable)
- ➤ General Education
- Major
- Auxiliary/Major Support Courses
- > Minor
- > Upper-Division,
- ➤ Additional Courses (that may be used as electives)
- > Insufficient
- ➤ In-progress Courses

Once a requirement is complete, a green box with a white check will appear next to the course. In-progress courses will have a blue box with a white tilde. If there is a requirement not met, there will be a red box and will read still need.

#### What is the Progress Bar?

The Progress Bar looks at all the requirement listed in the Degree block and **does not** just look at coursework alone.

## What catalog years are listed in DegreeWorks?

The most recent, seven years for Undergraduate and ten years for Graduate Studies. Example: Undergraduate 2012- Present

## Accessing DegreeWorks and Navigation

DegreeWorks is the new degree evaluation web-based program that is designed to help facilitate comprehensive academic advising and will be used for Course Program of Study (CPoS) to help The Financial Aid Office determine, which courses to pay using Federal Aid. The audits will compare a student academic history to the degree requirements for academic programs offered at Middle Tennessee State University. Please note DegreeWorks is not an official transcript nor official verification of degree completion. The graduation coordinator will determine when, the student meets all college requirements for graduation.

Enter student M# in the Student ID field or type name, press enter

## DegreeWorks Evaluation/Audit Layout

DegreeWorks displays the student's Program of Study with all the degree requirements listed. As an advisor, verify the student has the correct major consistent with his/her educational goals, review course requirements for accuracy, check for any discrepancies, troubleshoot any issue, and email the Registrar's Office for assistance at <a href="majordecentral-degreeworks@mtsu.edu">degreeworks@mtsu.edu</a>

## **Reviewing the Audit:**

The Program of Study is set-up in block format. The Student View block contains basic information including overall GPA, assigned advisor, and program, major, minor, concentration (if applicable), registration holds, graduation status, graduation program, and graduation term. The student-advisor is able to communicate through the email link by clicking on their name.




#### **What-If Analysis**

To process a What-If follow these steps:

- 1) Select a catalog year.
- 2) Select a program, major, and concentration (if applicable).
- 3) Add an additional program, major, concentration and/or minor (if applicable).
- 4) Next click Process What-If
- 5) To <u>Save as a PDF</u> instead of clicking Process What- If, click Save as a PDF.

Look Ahead Shows how remaining coursework will apply towards the Program of Study on the DegreeWorks audit.


Click Look Ahead on the right.




Enter the course (s) and click Add Course. See example below.
