

UP AND COMING BY LAURA TEK

On June 24, 1989, Nashville will again be beckoned to acknowledge its large and powerful gay and lesbian community when it hosts its Second Annual Gay Pride Parade and Rally. This important event, as in years past, is to commemorate the birth of the gay and lesbian liberation movement. Recognition of the gay rights struggle is especially momentus this year because it marks the 20th anniversary of the Stonewall rebellion in New York City.

GCN/Nashville will be there following the parade and subsequent rally every step of the way. Assisted by an intrepid band of amateur cameragoers, GCN will produce a documentary of our community's Pride '89 celebration. The July

broadcast of GCN's local programming segment Between The Lines will feature this first-of-a-kind locally made documentary.

We encourage you to attend the 1989 Gay Pride Parade and Rally and continue the momentum created by the Stonewall rebellion. But whether or not you attend, don't miss GCN's coverage and witness Nashville's celebration of the event that launched the movement for our freedom.

Also, please take note: the Los Angeles Gay and Lesbian Pride Parade is something everyone should see at least once. This year it's your turn! Gay Cable Network/Nashville is 'proud' to bring the L.A. parade via satellite. You will see a delayed satellite transmission of the most spectacular gay and lesbian pride parade in the country. It will come your way starting on Tuesday June 27 at 9:00 p.m.



Urinal

Starting June 20, GCN/Nashville will be showing John Greyson's most recent film, "Urinal".

Greyson, a Canadian filmmaker, has been critically acclaimed to be "original and offbeat", "amusingly outrageous", "funny and disturbing" and "the best and the looniest".

"Urinal", a 100-minute long film shot on locations in Canada deals with the issue of bathroom sex. "Because it's not exactly a popular subject for movies, even gay experimental movies, it presses all those buttons and raises all those questions that I'm interested in", Greyson explains. "A number of activists thanked me privately and quietly for making a film about something they weren't comfortable discussing. If they have problems with the subject, imagine how tough it must be for younger gays who are just coming to terms with their sexuality and who might frequent the tearooms and wind up persecuted and harassed".

The film will be shown in two 50-minute parts; part one on Tues June 20th, rerun on Sat. June 24th and part two on Tues. June 27th, rerun on July 1st.

Bob Hope on Anti-Gay/Lesbian Violence

At GLAAD's (Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation) request Bob Hope has filmed a public service announcement (PSA) condemning anti-gay violence. GLAAD contacted Hope in December 1988 after he had used the word "fag" in a joke on the "Tonight Show". Hope's public relations staff told GLAAD that he was "horrified" by negative reaction to his joke. GLAAD suggested that a prominent and staunch Republican celebrity like Hope could help the gay community by speaking out against anti-gay violence. Hope was interested and taped the PSA which was actually stronger than the one requested by GLAAD. The PSA was first broadcast on Feb. 28, when it was subject of a report on ABC's "Entertainment Tonight".

GCN/Nashville has been broadcasting the PSA regularly since May 20, when it concluded the second edition of "Between The Lines".

You flick on the six o'clock evening news in time to catch the latest development in the Supreme Court's decision on abortion. Everything seems all right until you realize that along with factual information, a distinct bias prevails in the reporting reflecting the newsperson's own opinions. You are outraged by this, especially since you disagree with the views expressed. You angrily phone the station to air your protest.

Now, what if Gay Cable Network were covering a story about, say, gay-bashing in Texas? A judge has handed down a relatively light sentence to a double murderer on the grounds that the victims were homosexual. Following the coverage the newsperson offers an address to which viewers may write urging formal action against the judge. How do you react? Are you appalled at the assumption that you might share the sentiments of the reporter? If you are one who regularly watches GCN, I seriously doubt you are feeling overly kindly toward the judge.

GCN undoubtly caters to what may be termed a "special interest" group. This is not to say every gay, lesbian, gay-affirmative or gay-curious person who watches GCN shares the same opinions on politics, religion, lifestyle, economics, etc. Even where there is agreement on issues, the intensity of conviction or interest in activism can vary greatly.

Still, GCN;s responsibility to its viewership must go beyond providing human interest stories and the latest in AIDS research. We are living in times when the voice of ultra-conservatives is strong across the land. While patiently ignoring the promise of "liberty and justice for all", these folks have appointed themselves as God's chosen few. (You know the ones I mean.) Now that racial and gender bigotry are widely considered unattractive, homophobia is the last solid camp of "acceptable" hatred in this country.

GCN cannot afford to remain neutral (i.e. wimpy) on the issues that directly affect our lives and our futures. To do so would be a dangerous and yes, cowardly mistake. Complacency and silence equal death or at the very least, continued oppression by an unenlightened society.





There's Going To Be A Parade In Your Living Room

Last year's Gay and Lesbian Pride Parade was a first for Nashville. This year will be another first; complete television coverage of our community's most fun and proudest day. GCN/Nashville is tickled pink about covering the event. Not only will we bring the parade right into your living room, but we'll also televise the other important activities of Gay and Lesbian Pride Week (June 17-25).

This year's Pride Parade is especially meaningful to GCN/Nashville, as it is to members of the community. You see, gays and lesbians in Great Britain have recently lost a tremendous freedom — the right to express their opinion. Any attempt to promote homosexuality in a positive light is illegal there. If you were in Great Britain, you would not be reading this, much less watching a parade in your living room.

Twenty years ago this June, there was another first; our community stood up for itself. Female impersonators at the Stonewall Inn in New York City decided that they had experience enough harassment from the local police. They refused to be arrested and led the community in what turned out to be a two-day riot. The gay and lesbian liberation movement had begun.

But where are we today in our fight for equality? We seem to be sitting passively on our bar stools as our rights slip silently away . . . just like it happened to gays and lesbians in Great Britain. Being able to watch the parade in your living room is great, but it isn't enough! This June 24th, Nashvillians will celebrate who they are. It's the day they will say to others 'I am proud to be gay'. Last year over 200 Nashvillians said just that.

The Fundamentalists are cranking up the paddy wagon, so speak up while you still have the right. Come join the Pride Parade on Saturday, June 24th, and be sure to catch it on GCN/Nashville.

URGENT!

Community Access Television's future is in jeopardy!

Mayor Boner wants to cut CAT's budget by 80%. If approved, this will effectively destroy Community Access. In addition, the mayor thinks he can integrate Community Access TV, which operates on cable channel 35, with the Government Access channel. Nashville would then become the first and only city in the country where the community access channel would be controlled by the government. It is not difficult to guess what that would men-goodbye to freedom of speech.

At this critical moment, it is imperative that our community come forward with all the support we can give to those who last September stood up for our right to free speech. Yes, if it weren't for all the people at Community Access who insisted that we, gays and lesbians, had the same right as any other group to broadcast *our* shows on television, there would have been no GCN/Nashville—our opponents would have had it all their own way.

So don't wait—call your local government officials today. Keep your message simple and straightforward:

- You support Community Access;
- You oppose Mayor Boner's plan to cripple Community Access;
- Metro government must allow Community Access to continue its work without creating artificial budgetary or bureaucratic constraints.
