SUPREME COURT STRIKES DOWN AMENDMENT 2

"Profound Victory For Principles of Democracy"

This week the U.S. Supreme Court ruled against Colorado's Amendment 2. The decision was 6 to 3, with Justices Kennedy, Ginsberg, Souter, Breyer, O'Connor, and Stevens ruling against Amendment 2, and Justices Rehnquist, Scalia, and Thomas dissenting. The measure would have amended the Colorado state constitution to overturn existing protections against discrimination based on sexual orientation and prohibit the passage of any such protection in the future. It was passed by majority vote in 1992. The following statement is attributable to Melinda Paras, National Gay and Lesbian Task Force (NGLTF) Executive Director. NGLTF is the nation's oldest gay and lesbian civil rights organization.

"The Supreme Court decision today on Colorado's Amendment 2 is a profound victory for all who believe in basic equal rights and the fundamental principle that all Americans deserve to live free from discrimination. It would have created special barriers to basic equal rights. It would have blocked the open and free participation in our democ-

ratic process for gays, lesbians and bisexuals.

We commend those justices who defended basic civil rights and stood up to the anti-democratic agenda of religious political extremists. This case was not just about gay, lesbian and bisexual people. At stake are the very principles of democracy: justice, freedom, personal liberty, and the right to be different and still live free from the tyranny of the majority. We are reminded of the words of Justice Blackmun, who in his 1986 dissent to the loathsome Hardwick v. Bowers case that upheld discriminatory sodomy laws, said, "The freedom to differ as to things that do not matter much is a mere shadow of freedom. The real test of its substance is the freedom to differ as to the things that

Thank you Supreme Court justices for protecting our constitutional freedoms. This is a joyous day for gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender Americans. The time is drawing closer when we do not have to live as second-class citizens anymore. When we can live free from violence, persecution, discrimination and intolerance. When the mistruths of religious, political extremists are exposed as lies.

GAY DAY AT DISNEY WORLD!

The traditional "wearing of red" continues to be a strong sign of support for the lesbian and gay community. Highly visible vacationers have made "GAY DAY at Disney" one of the most popular "gay and lesbian circuit parties" in the country, equal to events such as "Hotlanta's" River Expo in Atlanta, Colorado's Ski Weekend in Aspen and the Folsum Street Festival in San Francisco.

The 6th annual event has grown in popularity. It first began when a group of computer enthusiasts met there in 1990 sporting their red shirts. In 1994 the total grew to about 16,000 and almost doubled in size last year.

To help coordinate the mass, The Gay and Lesbian Community Services of Central Florida organized a clearinghouse of information and has produced a detailed gay tourist guide to help all the Lesbigay attendees make the most of Gay Day weekend in Orlando


"Gay Day at Disney" has received more national attention perhaps due to Disney's recent decision to extend health benefits to their employees' same-sex partners.


Apparently, Disney's decision to extend health benefits was due largely to finances. Disney purchased a company which already provided same-sex benefits. So Disney continued the practice.





AIDS drugs to patients who cannot afford

In a series of letters to the editor of the Wall Street Journal, health officials and others respond to a recent article which reported that a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention public education campaign exaggerates the risk of AIDS to the gener-al public. Dr. David Satcher, director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and Dr. Helene Gayle, director of its National Center for HIV, STD, and TB Prevention, write in a joint letter that the article was unbalanced and incomplete. They argue that the broad public education campaign was important in curbing the spread of HIV, noting the decline in the rate of AIDS in some groups. Dr. C. Everett Koop, former Surgeon General, also objects to the "seriously flawed article." Koop writes that the government made the best decision it could-to educate the general public—because there was evidence that HIV would not be contained in high-risk groups, saying "it was the right thing to do in 1987. It is still the right thing to do." Meanwhile, William, M. London, of the American Council on Science and Health, applauds the article, adding that he has tried to spread the same message and has been criticized for it.

FANFARE: BOXING

The California State Assembly passed a bill that requires boxers to test HIV-negative in order to be licensed in the state. The bill came in response to the announcement that former heavyweight Tommy Morrison has HIV. Seven states and Puerto Rico required yearly HIV tests before Morrison's announcement, and other states have since implemented the requirement.

DIALING UP AN AIDS CURE

Bell Atlantic customers in Maryland, Virginia, and the District of Columbia now have the option of donating 1 percent of their monthly bill to support AIDS research at the Whitman-Walker Clinic. For the project, part of the company's Community Threads program, donations are paid by Bell Atlantic, based on the Bell Atlantic portion of the bill, and do not add to the cost to the customer. The project was started in April 1995 on a trial basis and made official in November.

POWER ON WHEELS FOR AIDS FIGHT

HIV/AIDS DIGEST

The first-ever Florida AIDS ride ended on Sunday on Miami's South Beach, as 757 cyclists rode into Flamingo Park to celebrate the end of their three-day ride from Orlando and the \$1.5 million they had raised for several AIDS organizations in the state. Riders had to raise at least \$1,400 to participate in the event, which ended with much emotion and celebration.

DRUGSTORE COWBOYS

A black market for prescription drugs has been on the decline but may now resurge as demand for protease inhibitors The AIDS drug black market, in which people who receive the drugs free from clinics sell them for a profit, is generally unprosecuted, since drug enforcement efforts are often focused elsewhere. David Gilden, of Gay Men's Health Crisis, notes that the black market for AIDS drugs has declined on its own in recent years, as the price of AZT has fallen. The new protease inhibitors, as well as cutbacks in funding for Medicaid and other programs that pay for AIDS drugs, may help to raise demand again, however. In addition, some small pharmacies are buying black-market drugs and selling them at retail prices to compete with larger stores. Drugs bought on the black market may not be safe due to improper storage. Furthermore, since most people buying black-market drugs are taking them without medical care, any side effects could go untreated. Thomas Staffa, assistant attorney general in the New York Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, says that AIDS drugs account for just a small portion of the black market for prescription drugs, claiming that it is "the high-priced drugs, like those for cancer, or Prozac, that command the most money.

SITTING PRIDDY

Laurie Priddy, who was fired from her job in 1991 after disclosing that she had HIV, says the anger she felt from the experience gave her the impetus to speak out as an AIDS activist. She now educates professional basketball players and their partners about HIV and AIDS through the NBA Players Association (NBPA) AIDS program. The program was organized through the Johns Hopkins School of Public Health, following Magic Johnson's disclosure. She has also worked on the curriculum and training for the NBA's Winning Against AIDS program, in which NBA players educate inner-city kids about HIV at basketball camps. She frequently shocks people in her sessions, and helps them to see that anyone is vulnerable to the virus, by telling them she has HIV. She regrets the way gender and race have divided the activist community, fearing that the fight for funding and rights for people with HIV will suffer. Priddy's husband, whom she met after she was found to have HIV, is HIV-negative. They live in Baltimore, and when not working to fight discrimination, Priddy enjoys fishing and crabbing along the Chesapeake, and riding her motorcycle in rural Maryland.







SUPREME COURT

When the horrible rhetoric that we seek "special rights" or that we threaten "traditional family values" is replaced with the truth that we demand the same basic equal rights that all Americans enjoy, including the ability to work free from discrimination and nurture our own families.

This ruling should be the stake through the heart of the divisive, unconstitutional and extremist anti-gay ballot measure campaigns of the Radical Right. Last year we defeated a similar measure in Maine. In 1994, despite a Republican sweep in the elections, voters rejected antigay measures in Oregon and Idaho. In 1992, Oregon defeated yet another measure. In fact, Amendment 2 was the only state anti-gay ballot measure to be passed, even though it never went into effect. Now, it too has been struck.

Let this be a message to the sponsors of these bills: The American people do not support your campaigns of intolerance and bigotry. They do not support discrimination against gays, lesbians and bisexuals. They do not want you tying up their courts in costly, prolonged legal battles. They do not want you to come to their communities to destroy and divide. Let this message be heard in every state where voters are considering anti-gay ballot measures in 1996 - on election day this year strike down your anti-gay ballot measures just as the Supreme Court has struck down Amendment 2.

Unfortunately, our victory may be short-lived. Despite this ruling, the Radical Right will not stop. They are already evolving their measures to make them more difficult to challenge in court, such as the failed attempt in Maine last year that simply "omitted" gay people and others from the list of those protected against discrimination. They are launching other attacks, including anti-education measures that censor the teaching of diversity in public schools, or "parents rights" rhetoric that really tear apart families and communities instead of building stronger ones. Religious political extremists will not stop until they have advanced their broader, anti-democratic, repressive agenda. An agenda that rolls back civil rights for people of color; scapegoats gays, immigrants and others for our country's social and economic problems; and denies women constitutionally protected reproductive freedom.

That's why we call on all gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people to remain vigilant. We call on all our families, friends, and neighbors, as well as all Americans of conscience to stand with us as we struggle for basic equal rights. The National Gay and Lesbian Task Force (NGLTF) launched its "Undo 2: The Supreme Response" campaign last October during hearings on the case. At that time scores of people in more than 35 cities held vigils and rallies to speak up for justice. Today, a similar number of communities were poised for this announcement.

SUPREME RESPONSE

NGLTF announced a 4-point "Supreme Response" call-to-action plan in the wake of this ruling. They anticipate a backlash from the radical right to this ruling, and we must be prepared.

Our Supreme Response campaign will:

(1) Organize events to celebrate the ruling! More than 40 cities are already slated to protest. We urge people to join in these actions and make their voices heard.

(2) Call on elected officials in the U.S. Congress and in state and local governments to support comprehensive protections against discrimination based on sexual orientation. We ask them to sign our "Justice for All" resolution and immediately introduce civil rights laws in the next legislative session. We will work with our grassroots lobbying and NGLTF cooperating organizations to mobilize a critical mass of support for local and state anti-discrimination measures. We call on

President Clinton to lead the charge for federal anti-discrimination protections. President Clinton and other elected officials must do what the Supreme Court justices would not: ensure basic civil rights for gay, lesbian and bisexual Americans.

(3) Gather activists from every state at the Creating Change Conference this November. We'll strategize on how to mobilize our communities and our allies to fight for basic equal rights, respond to the backlash, including fighting state ballot measures and other radical right attacks. Creating Change is the largest conference of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender activists in the country.

(4) Launch through our NGLTF web page a "Supreme Response" electronic network to inform and mobilize activists nationwide. Log onto our web page at http://www.ngltf.org to get plugged into actions and information.

This was a momentous day for our movement and for all those who believe in personal liberty, justice and freedom. We are making progress toward ending intolerance and educating America about who we really are. At the same time we know our battle is not over. We must remain on guard and defend against what surely will be a backlash. With the ruling, we are one important step closer to attaining our dream of a more compassionate and fair society.

The National Gay and Lesbian Task Force is a progressive organization that has supported grassroots organizing and pioneered in national advocacy since 1973. Since its inception, NGLTF has been at the forefront of virtually every major initiative for lesbian and gay rights. In all its efforts, NGLTF helps to strengthen the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender movement at the state level while connecting these activities to a national vision for change.



him the most treasured legacy that a gay person could ever hope to achieve--scandal, but more importantly scandal beyond that of just being gay. If we as a community are to achieve collective equality, we must show everyone that we are just as capable as straight

people in age-old endeavors such as stealing, cheating and plagiarizing. The notoriety the author received after the initial release of While England Sleeps and the subsequent lawsuit filed by Stephen Spender has been instrumental in our mission to purport some semblance of human equality. Leavitt has admitted that portions of his novel are based on Spender's autobiography, and Spender was successful with his lawsuit.

Even though sometimes the story behind the story is more interesting, the tale of Brian Botsford and Edward Phelan as narrated by Brian in While England Sleeps is an excellent addition (whoever the author) to an ever-increasing volume of gay-themed work.

Leavitt weaves a heart-wrenching story of love realized too late; a universal story of class differential, betrayal, and a life forever changed and filled with the reality that happiness is a lazy, morbid creature, which on a good life may deliver a lone soulmate only to whisk him away under the guise of propriety.

Using a backdrop of pre-World War II England and Spain, we follow struggling novelist, Brian, through his two worlds. One filled with the luxuries of the

The latest being with Philippa Archibald, who Brian believes he can love and live with forever, thus forgoing the struggle to maintain, yet separate, his dramatically different

lives. Since the union between Brian and Philippa would please Aunt Constance tremendously, Brian would be assured of his elderly Aunt's continued support. As with most men, Brian breaks rule #1 of Lifelong Planning: Check with the straight woman first.

For the most part, Brian's other life is shared with the younger Edward, who with giant puppy dog eyes looks through a hazy innocence for life's answers, Edward's search for inclusion progresses (with the help of one of Brian's old school "chums") to the world of communism and the Spanish frontline. Overburdened with guilt and possibly love, Brian, with his own newly-acquired communist party card, sets out across Europe to rescue Edward. Typically, as the search is prolonged and fruitless, Brian finds others to soothe his wounds while Edward's plight worsens.

Leavitt's chaotic reunion of the two lovers and the events that follow during their return home compels the reader to reflect on our haphazard daily existence and perpetual inability to negotiate through the simplest elements of life's cycle: love, commitment, and loss.





JUSTICE ON THE REBOUND

"Bowers v.Hardwick". In that decision, the right wing activists on the Supreme Court ignored all logic and precedent to find that the

Constitutional right to privacy does not extend to private sexual conduct between consenting adults.

That decision has since earned its place in a book devoted to the 10 worst Supreme Court decisions ever. One of the justices who created the majority of five (the smallest possible majority on a court with nine justices) has since stated publicly that he made a mistake in voting to uphold Georgia's sodomy statue (which lawyers in Georgia are now challenging underthe state constitution, just as Abby Rubenfeld has done here)

"Bowers v. Hardwick" demonstrated clearly that several justices on that court could not

prevent homophobia from clouding their jurisprudential abilities (which were not well developed in the first place in some cases). But the composition of the court has changed considerably since

And so, as a fitting celebration of the tenth anniversary of "Bowers v. Hardwick, a solid majority of justices defeated the right wing activists by declaring that the state of Colorado cannot limit lesbians' and gay men's access to the political process. On Monday, May 20, "the Supremes" issued their decision in the case of "Romer v. Evans". This decision is very good news for lesbian and gay civil rights. But it's good news in the same way that hearing the rain finally stop is good news in a flood: you still have to wait for the water to go down before you can clean up the mess.

The decision in "Romer v. Evans" guarantees equal opportunity for lesbians and gay men only in the very broadest sense. It struck down a Colorado state constitutional amendment that repealed existing local ordinances insofar as they outlawed

Ten years ago, lesbian and gay civil rights hit bottom in discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation, and prohibited the enactment of any such ordinances in the future. Thus, in declaring that amendment unconstitutional, "the Supremes" mere-

ly removed a significant obstacle to lesbian/gay civil rights ordinances except in Boulder, Aspen, and Denver, where they already exist.

In other words, what we have now is the same right as everyone else to participate in the political process on our own behalf. This is no small thing, to be sure. But the mere fact that the Supremes had to issue an opinion stating this principle (especially given that the three right wing activists, Scalia, Thomas, and Rehnquist voted against us) is a sad statement indeed.

But for now, it seems, things have stopped getting worse. It's still up to us to make sure

that they get better. Every United States citizen should have equal access to the political procss, regardless of irrelevant characteristics. Yet access to the political process is meaningless if you don't make use of it.

I think that the decision in "Romer v. Evans" is sufficiently important that I want to discuss specific aspects of it in greater detail over the next few weeks. I want to speculate a bit on the implications of this decision for other lesbian/gay civil rights issues. I want to relate the gist of Antonin Scalia's dissent from the majority's opinion, if only to expound on the theme that Justice Scalia is from another planet. And I want to explain why I think that this decision in favor of lesbian/gay civil rights is a very conservative decision.

Above all, however, my message is the same as it has always been: the responsibility for our equal rights and equal treatment in this society lies primarily with us. "The Supremes" can help to ensure that we have the same tools for equality as everyone else. Only we can make something constructive with those tools.

HARD ON DOLE

Back in our corner of the world, the problems of a few foreign journalists haven't received much attention. Yet, when they do, it'll be one more headache for Bob Dole. On the heels of a dramatic and emotional departure from the Senate, he's being

This is truly a sad state of affairs, because you can't help but like Bob Dole. He's someone you'd be pleased to have as your grandfather. Meanwhile, his wife, Elizabeth Dole, is exceedingly likeable, easily whipping Hillary Clinton in that department. Though, of course, Elizabeth Dole can get a bit testy when you call her one of her old nicknames. After all, "Liddy" is childish sounding. And her nickname as Transportation Secretary in the Reagan administration, given for her ability to win over legislators to her points of view was truly suspect: "Sugar Lips." Given the recent foreign alphabet imbroglio, it's even worse. Imagine

the caption under the photo if Dole wins the election: JUBILANT PENIS EMBRACES SUGAR LIPS.

Yet, perhaps this whole alphabet exposure is just the sort of raciness that Bob Dole needs to energize his campaign. since it is my worldwide commitment and global obligation to give everyone a thoroughly boring image of what lesbians are really like, what changes me in your mind from a symbol to a

flesh and blood human with needs and rights and wants and flaws, is what will do the same for huge lumps of the population."

"Oh, you've met my in-laws. Mr. And Mrs. Huge Lump. I'd like to introduce you to my pet lesbian. Sure, ruin the fantasies for everyone. I mean, can you see guys everywhere looking over their shoulders as they go into that XXX room at their video stores looking for the thrill of watching you and your partner cleaning out your swimming pool. Or playing bridge with another boring lesbian couple? Or us? Whooooo. Now there's a hot seller. Gotta get me some stock in that movie company."

"Yeah, but that's the point, Socrates. If all I am to everybody who makes laws is this tower of seething eroticism, (Oooh you know that does kind of have a nice ring to it.) If all I am is that, with no real life to speak of, then when it comes time for me to get, oh, let's say, um...health insurance at the office for my sweetie, the human resources department recommends me for immediate transfer to the lobotomy lab. And my honey can't get a discount nose job, or emergency electroshock because she's not working this month, and it messes up your fantasy life."

"Oh, yeah." He conceded grudgingly. "I see what you mean. I suppose you should have something to say about cemetery rights, if the worst happens. And you are about the only girl-person I can talk to who doesn't always seem to be coming on to me." "You just don't know enough lesbians."

"Right. Could you introduce me to some sexy ones."

"You know, Pal, you're going to look amazingly sensual with raspberry jelly from my donut oozing down your forehead." We laughed. The waitress poured another cup of coffee. And, much to his libido's loss, we knew each other just a little better than we did when we sat down. I know that the polls all show that it is much more difficult to be homophobic with people you actually know. And Manny and I seemed to be living proof. He knew I wasn't after his wife. And I knew I had a friend I could trust, even if it meant he had to let go of his idea of me, well, his mythical lesbian, as a sex goddess. <sigh> It's a sacrifice, but, hey, somebody's got to do it.

ANTI-GAY RESOLUTION DEFEATED

The defeat of a Spartanburg, South Carolina County anti-gay resolution has been a tiny Stonewall for the Upstate of South Carolina.

U.S.A. Gymnastics threatened to pull the U.S. men's gymnastics team training out of the county scheduled for July 3-12, if the Spartanburg County Council did not rescind the anti-gay resolution.

The vote was 4-1 with two members absent, to rescend the resolution. "Our job is to run this county, not dictate morality" said one of the councilmen. One can disagree with the gay marriage resolution, but there's a world of difference in passing a resolution which states gay and lesbian citizens are not compatible with the county's "values."

The heated controvesary has energized many lesbians, gay men, bisexuals and transgendered persons. The normally sleepy little gay community was energized by the defeated anti-gay resolution. A number of community members broke their silence, came forth and took a stance.

AMBER RICHARDS

Amber Richards a popular entertainer in the Atlanta, died last week in an accidental house fire. A legendary entertainer, was well-known throughout the south and elsewhere in the country. She had won many pageant titles such as Miss Continental USA, Miss Atlanta Pride Emeritus, and Southern Voice Glamour Goddess of Drag.

Amber Richard's catch phrase: "A Queen may die, but a Goddess lives forever." Glamourous, successful, sharp tongued and loyal to a fault, Amber was memorialized with an out-pouring of grief that friends

and fans shared with her large family, rushing to Atlanta from all around the South.

The obituary read: Amber Marie Richards-Williams, 38 died of smoke inhalation in the early hours of Sunday, May 10th, as a result of a fire in her home in Smryna that Cobb County fire officials have ruled as accidental. Lisa Marie Mazur, 27, of Midtown, a friend who had driven home with Amber late Saturday night, also perished in the unusual fire.

According to Cobb County fire officials, a candle or cigarette most likely started a smoldering fire that filled the house with smoke before extinguishing for lack of oxygen. No sign of fire or smoke was visible from the exterior of the home.

EDDIE MURPHY APOLOGIZES

Actor and comedian Eddie Murphy apologizes for the homophobic and AIDSphobic remarks he made early on in his career on a HBO special. AIDS activists demanded that Murphy be removed as a guest on the David Letterman Show.

FLOCK TO ATLANTA

Hundreds of lesbians and gay men flocked to Atlanta to participate in the 18th Annual Atlanta's Armory Sports Classic over the Memorial Day Weekend.

What started out as a small regional softball tournement has grown tremendously to a fierce on field competition of six sports and a huge social gathering.

The atheletes competed in softball, soccer, bowling, billiards, tennis and golf. Even if the teams played two games and lost, they still had a weekend full of socializing.

MINISTER'S REBUTAL TO DESCICION

By what apology does the U.S. Olympic Committee justify itself in censoring municipalities who by the free exercise of constitutionally appointed government pass legislation that proscribes homosexual marriage? I am stunned.

Their recent actions, statements, and threats against both Cobb County, GA., and now Spartanburg County provides every indication that the U.S. Olympic Committee proposes to advance the cause of homosexuality in the United States.

It has not only overstepped its function or purpose by meddling in the affairs of a self-governing municipality but has also now ventured into the realm of civic morality, attempting, in effect, to compel community to cease opposing homosexuality. I am further amazed that such threats on the part of the U.S. Olympic Committee would evoke such fear from our politicians. I applaud those municipalities who have taken a public stand against perversion and enacted proscriptive legislation against homosexual marriage.
