

Health & Human Performance Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA) Qualifications

Minimum requirements for consideration for a Health and Human Performance (HHP) GTA position:

- 1) Be unconditionally admitted to the College of Graduate Studies
- 2) Be unconditionally admitted to a Health and Human Performance Graduate Program
- 3) Master's students seeking an assistantship must have a minimum overall GPA of 3.0, whether undergraduate or graduate.
- 4) Doctoral students seeking an assistantship must have a minimum GPA of 3.25.

- One letter of recommendation that addresses: (1) your academic ability to do graduate work, <u>and</u> (2) your potential to teach undergraduate courses
- Official transcript(s) from each college or university attended. (*These transcripts are in addition to the transcripts submitted to the College of Graduate Studies for your application for admission.*) **Transcripts cannot be issued to the student.** They must be mailed **directly from the institution** to the address listed above.
- Copies of certifications (i.e., WSI, First Aid, CPR, ACSM, Athletic Training, etc.)
- Current curriculum vita

Deadline for all materials to be received by HHP (and to be fully admitted) to be considered for a graduate teaching assistantship:

Fall Admission: March 1

Spring Admission: October 1
