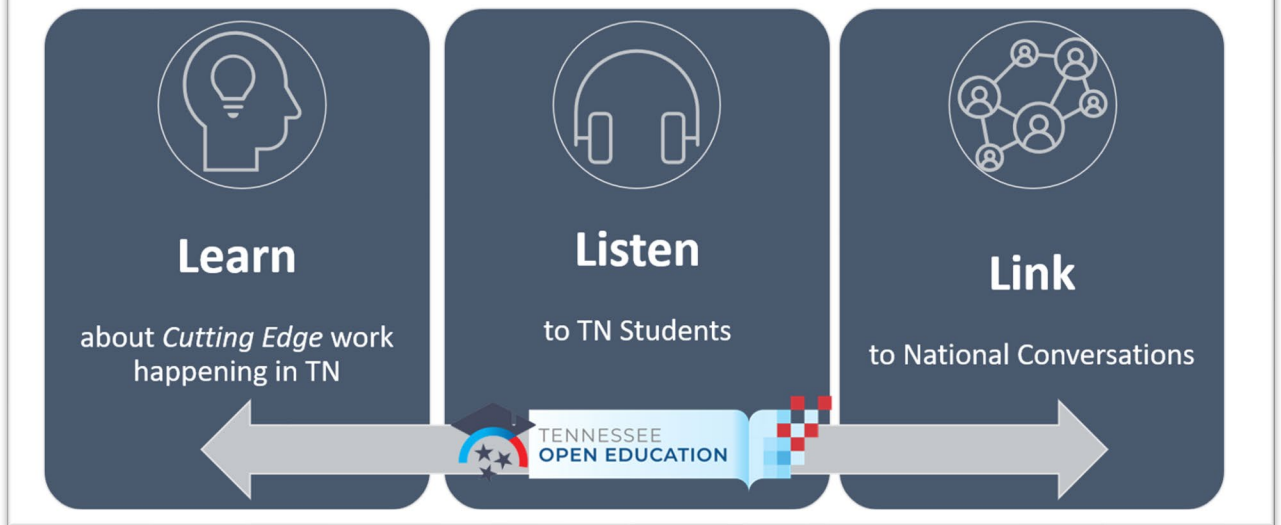


# TN Open Education Week 2023
