## **Agency History/Biographical Sketch:**

James "Jim" Free was born January 17, 1947 in Columbia, TN. James C. Free attended Middle Tennessee State University where he received a bachelor's degree in Economics (1969) and a master's degree in Public Administration (1972).

Free served in the Tennessee office of Governor Ned McWherter and Tennessee House of Representatives. In 1976, Free worked on Jimmy Carter's presidential campaign as southern regional coordinator. After Carter's election to the presidency, Free served as a special assistant to the president for Congressional Affairs and supported President Carter's programs before Congress.

In 1995, Free co-founded the Smith-Free Group, a bipartisan government affairs firm. Previously he was vice-chair of Walker-Free Associates. He represented American businesses in areas of entertainment, communications, and intellectual property, among others.

Free has served on the Board of the Country Music Association and the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum. He and his wife, Ann, are generous supporters of the arts and humanities including The Kennedy Center, the Nashville Public Library, and many others.

## **Scope and Content:**

This collection is comprised of 3 linear feet of materials. The materials relate to James Free's work and philanthropy in and around the music industry, mostly in Washington, DC and Nashville, TN. Free collected manuscript papers, programs, passes, invitations, photographs, and commercial audio/visual material relating to his work, especially the

Country Music Association and The Kennedy Center. The bulk of this collection are programs, invitations and passes to events related to these institutions.
