## This week's e-mail addresses Open Educational Resources (OERs).

Open Education Resources (OERs) are resources that can be freely obtained and used in your courses through a digital platform. As a university, we are working hard to provide innovative resources and course activities for faculty. Several services are available to support you in efforts to locate appropriate resources, many from peer reviewed or otherwise vetted locations.

- Are you looking for digital science labs, an accessible periodic table, or a virtual whiteboard for math courses?
- Interested in supplementing your lecture with videos from other subject matter experts?
- Need a case study for your business courses?
- Looking for a virtual museum, streaming opera, or other cultural event?
- What about images that represent diversity in your course content?

These and many others can be located across the internet, but we want to help you narrow your search. MTSU Online has repositories for OERs that list institutional resources such as the James E. Walker Library, MERLOT, The Mason OER Metafinder, Openstax, and many more.
