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**This week’s e-mail is designed around a very important element of distance education – assessment.**

Essays and written responses on exams are excellent methods for assessing student analysis, application, and evaluation. But these also take time to grade effectively, and students are likely writing essays for almost every course. If feasible, why not try something different? Today’s students thrive when they can effectively connect course materials to real world experiences (whether remote, online, or in-person), a future career, or the greater development of self. So why not ask students to create an infographic?

As visual representations that favor images over lengthy text, and commonly used in academia and in the world of work, infographics require students to analyze, evaluate, and create knowledge in a concise manner. They could involve a visual representation of trends or concepts; something different like a step-by-step instructional guide; a great way to compare and contrast theories, policies, regulations, system types, etc.; or as an educational handout to accompany a presentation.
