# **Information for Majors**

If you decide to major in I-O Psychology (**INPS**), be sure to specify **I-O Psychology**, not just Psychology; they are different majors.

Use an upper-division form to a worksheet to plan your course work. Your advisors will also have forms available. If you have transferred from another university be sure to see an advisor as soon as possible to get credit for coursework taken elsewhere. You will have TWO advisors – a college advisor and a faculty advisor.

The internship course - PSY 4730 Internship: Industrial - is for students who have completed many of the required I/O classes - typically seniors or juniors.

**Plan your schedule of courses carefully**. Some of the I/O required courses are offered **only once a year**, and most courses have a limited number of sections offered. If you have scheduling restrictions (e.g., only Tuesday-Thursday classes), you may have difficulty getting the courses you need. Also, we offer a few, but NOT all, required courses online. We recommend that you register as early as possible to ensure entry into required classes. I/O courses are typically offered as follows:

Fall, Spring, sometimes Summer:

#### Fall ONLY:

PSY 4270 Personnel Selection and Placement required PSY 4290 Compensation System Design/Admin required PSY 4340 Human Factors Psychology elective

#### Individually scheduled:

PSY 4730 Internship: Industrial *elective* PSY 3990 Research in Psychology *elective* 

If this scheduling must be changed, we will let the advisors know.

#### ONLINE classes.

SOME of the I-O classes are offered online. However, you *cannot* complete the I-O psychology major completely online. Many of the psychology foundation classes, however, are available online. The I-O classes currently available online are: PSY 3320, PSY 4360, and PSY 4330. Additionally, PSY 4370 is offered as a blended course. Some electives may also be available online.

#### **Pre-approved Minors:**

A list of approved minors for I-O Psychology majors is listed below. *The I-O Psychology major only requires ONE minor*. We generally recommend one of the business minors: Business Administration, Business Law, Business Analytics, Information Systems, or Management.

Other minors may be approved by the faculty advisor.

Discuss with your major and minor advisors which courses in those minors would be good choices. *Registration controls* may prohibit enrollment in Management classes unless you have earned at least 60 hours. Currently I-O psychology majors are pre-approved for minors in the college of business.

You must have a total of 120 hours to graduate! General education + major + minor < 120.

**SHRM.** We recommend that any student interested in I-O Psychology or any field related to Human Resources join the MTSU chapter of the Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM). **Internships**. An internship enhances your job prospects upon graduation. Unfortunately, not everyone who wants to find an internship is able to do so. <u>Finding an internship will take effort</u>. 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# FAQs

## What is Industrial/Organizational (I-O) Psychology?

I-O Psychology is a subfield of psychology which applies psychology in the workplace. It includes areas such as employee selection, performance appraisal, training and development, compensation and benefits, work attitudes and motivation, leadership, and occupational health. ## Does I-O Psychology involve psychotherapy or mental health services?

No.

## Would I be a "psychologist" with a B.S. in I-O Psychology?

No, a psychologist has a doctorate in psychology and must be licensed.

## What kind of work would a person with a B.S. in I-O Psychology do?

This major prepares one for an entry-level position in Human Resources. Some possible job titles may be Human Resources Representative, Recruiter, HR Coordinator, HR Assistant, or Training Specialist. ## Do many colleges and universities offer this type of program?

No, some colleges and universities offer one introductory course in I/O Psychology at the undergraduate level, and some offer none. I-O Psychology programs are usually at the graduate level (master's or doctorate) only. This program at MTSU is quite unique.

## What if I want to go to graduate school in I-O Psychology?

You may prepare for graduate study in I-O Psychology by majoring in Psychology or I-O psychology. Discuss your plans with your **FACULTY** advisor as soon as possible so that you know how to prepare for graduate school.
